Application for a study permit – Checklist

Any document not in English or French must be accompanied by a certified translation.

Failure to submit all required documentation may result in the refusal of your application or processing delays.

It is normally advisable to wait until you receive the letter of authorization to study in Canada from the Embassy before paying tuition fees and finalizing travel plans.

Note: If you are a legal resident of Morocco who also currently resides there, and you have been accepted to study at a designated post-secondary school in Canada, you may be eligible to get your study permit through the Student Direct Stream.

You must submit the following items:	
If you are 18 years old and older, “Fiche anthropométrique” from Morocco and criminal records from all countries you have resided in for more than six months.	<input type="checkbox"/>
Proof of employment or internship, if applicable	<input type="checkbox"/>
Your birth certificate and the birth certificate(s) of any dependent person (s).	<input type="checkbox"/>
Diplomas and transcripts obtained up to date, since the last two years of the BAC (High School) All documents in a language other than English or French must be translated and certified. Please submit a copy in the original language and the translation.	<input type="checkbox"/>
Proof of your language skills: TEF (French), IELTS OR TOEFL (English) test results (optional)	<input type="checkbox"/>
If you have answered “yes” to any of the background information questions on the application form, provide a completed and signed Schedule 1 form (Application for Temporary Resident Visa – IMM 5257B) and include it with your application.	<input type="checkbox"/>
