Application for a Study Permit - Checklist

Failure to submit all required documentation may result in processing delays or in the refusal of your application.

False statements or submission of fraudulent documents will result in refusal and may lead to legal action against you.

You must include a certified translation with any documents that are not in English or French. Provide both a photocopy of the original document and the translation in English or French. Unless otherwise indicated, submit only photocopies of the documents requested. IRCC will not return the documents you provide with your application.

We do not offer pre-assessment or counselling services. Submit your completed application with all your supporting documents and the appropriate fees and a Migration Officer will assess it.

An interview may be required. You will be informed accordingly.

If a medical examination is required, you will be informed by an officer who will send you instructions on how to proceed. Do <u>not</u> undergo a medical exam until advised by this office.

Any preparation you make, such as paying administration or tuition fees, are done entirely at your own risk.

Do not finalize travel arrangements until you have received a positive decision on your study permit application.

All study permit applicants must submit:

All documentation listed in the Generic Document Checklist for a Study Permit (IMM 5483)	
If you have answered "yes" to any of the background information questions on the application form, provide a completed and signed Schedule 1 form (Application for Temporary Resident Visa – IMM 5257B) and include it with your application.	
Proof of immigration status in the country in which you are	
currently residing If you do not reside in your country of citizenship,	_
provide a copy of your permanent, temporary stay permit, work permit or	_
study permit (include the issue and expiry date)	
Family Information Form [IMM 5707], fully completed, dated and signed.	
You must answer every question. If not applicable, write N/A.	
If your letter of admission specifies that an internship, work term or on the	
job training is required as part of your program of studies in Canada, please	
underline or highlight that information on the letter. A Work Permit will then	
be issued at the same time as the Study Permit, without extra fees.	

Study Plan: Submit a one page study plan which answers the following	
questions and includes any other information relevant to the processing of your application:	
Why do you wish to study in Canada in the program for which you	
have been accepted?	
What is your overall educational goal?	
What is your overall cadeational goal: Why are you not pursuing a similar program in your country of	
residence or citizenship?	
Academic documents – only required for those applying to do post-	
secondary studies in Canada	
 Copies of transcripts / mark sheets for most recent secondary or 	
post-secondary program undertaken AND	
Copy of most recent secondary or post-secondary degree / diploma /	
certificate OR, if you have not yet graduated, indicate the expected	
date of graduation and whether you will receive a degree, diploma,	
or certificate.	
Police certificates : If you are 18 years of age or over and the duration of	
your stay in Canada will be more than six months, please provide police	
certificates:	
From your current country of residence, if you have resided there for	
six months or more (NOTE: the police certificate must be issued	
within six months before you apply); and	
From the country where you have spent most of your adult life since	
the age of 18 (NOTE: the police certificate must be issued after you	
last lived in that country).	
Additional documents for minors (less than 18 years of age)	
Copy of birth certificate	
Minors travelling alone, if you have not provided a Custodianship	
Declaration:	
Submit a letter of authorization from your parents / guardians	
consenting to your study in Canada as well as a copy of the page of	
the passport or other government-issued identification document	
showing their names, photo and signatures.	
Minors travelling with only one parent or legal guardian, if you have	
not provided a Custodianship Declaration:	
Submit a letter of authorization from your non-accompanying parent	
or guardian consenting to your study in Canada as well as a copy of	
the page of the passport or other government-issued identification	
document showing the name, photo and signature of your non-	
accompanying parent / guardian.
